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## **Earn Your Stars and Finish Your Year Strong!** ***Mirixa Stars Programs*** ***Adherence Cases are Available Through Year's End!***

There are currently numerous Mirixa Stars Program cases available through the MirixaPro<sup>SM</sup> platform. Many of these programs will continue to produce cases through the end of the year and all of them share the following traits:

- Each Adherence Targeted Intervention Program case should be very brief, taking the pharmacist about 5 minutes to complete.
- Your pharmacy will earn between \$12 and \$35 per case, depending on the program.
- Adherence cases can potentially help you improve your pharmacy's overall clinical performance which may help reduce fee impacts.
- Adherent patients fill their prescriptions more often, potentially creating volume and foot traffic in your store.
- These cases are available for a short time frame (many have a ten-day early removal) so it is imperative that pharmacists review for cases often and conduct them immediately.

## **Resolving Statin Omission Care Gap Alerts**



Often, in CMR or Star Ratings cases in MirixaPro<sup>SM</sup>, pharmacists may be asked to address an omission care gap alert based on the absence of a statin for a patient who has, or appears to be at risk for, atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD). While addressing this type of alert, it's important to understand that:

1. This alert is based on the patient having ASCVD or potential risk factors, including diabetes
2. This alert is NOT limited to a diagnosis of dyslipidemia,
3. The patient may not already be aware of this risk,
4. The patient may not be taking a statin because it was never prescribed.

First, confirm whether the patient is taking a statin. (In a CMR, this can be done while updating the list of the patient's current medications.)

If the patient is NOT taking a statin, begin resolving the alert by selecting "Confirmed Omission." If the patient reports that they've never been prescribed a statin, or if the patient is unaware of the need for a statin, educate the patient, document the alert as a "Confirmed Omission," and send a recommendation to the patient's prescriber to consider adding a statin.

Conversely, select "Falsely Identified" if:

1. The patient is taking a statin (obtained through another source or without insurance). In a CMR, you should add the statin to the Medications list
2. The patient was taking a statin, but the prescriber discontinued it
3. The patient does not have the related medical condition (ASCVD and/or diabetes)
